Job Corps is a free education and training program that helps young people learn a career, earn a high school diploma or GED, and find and keep a good job. For eligible young people at least 16 years of age up through age 24 that qualify as low income, Job Corps provides the all-around skills needed to succeed in a career and in life.

Training centers are located in Dayton, Cincinnati and Cleveland, plus others in Michigan and Kentucky. All housing and meals are provided for the entire length of the training.
